

There's more to libraries than books!

Get online and discover fantastic information resources, available free to all Territorians.

Registered NT Public Library members can access a great range of electronic information resources, either from your local public library, from the Northern Territory Library in Parliament House, or from home.

Resources include online encyclopaedias, databases of full-text journal articles on a wide range of topics, online picture books for children, and a fantastic online tutoring service for students.

Just a few of the information resources available:

The Australian and NZ Reference Centre (ANZRC): Australian and New Zealand specific magazines, newspapers, newswires and reference books in Australia's largest collection of regional full-text content. Northern Territory News, Sunday Territorian and Centralian Advocate newspapers are available in this database.

The Health and Wellness Resource Centre including Alternative Health Module: A medical reference centre of full-text health and medical information from a variety of sources including journal articles, reference books and news sources. Includes an alternative health module.

Tumblebooks: An interactive site featuring animated talking picture books, along with puzzles and quizzes, aimed at helping young children to read. Also includes resources for teachers.



YourTutor: An interactive online service for students from grades 4-12 and adult learners. You can access free individual homework and assignment help from expert tutors in all subjects. The service is provided in a secure chat environment between the hours of 3 to 8 pm each week day.

NT Libraries iPortal is your first step to access these and the full range of electronic resources.

Global Issues in Context



Global Issues in Context offers international viewpoints on a broad spectrum of global issues, topics, and current events.

Featured are hundreds of continuously updated issue and country portals that bring together a variety of specially selected, highly relevant sources for analysis of social, political, military, economic, environmental, health, and cultural issues. Each of these gateway pages includes an overview, unique "perspectives" articles written by local experts, reference, periodical, primary source and statistical information. Rich multimedia - including podcasts, video, and interactive graphs - enhance each portal. Use Browse Issues and Topics, Country Finder, Basic Search or Advanced Search to explore the database.

GREENR

(Global Reference on the Environment, Energy, and Natural Resources)



GREENR focuses on the physical, social, and economic aspects of environmental issues.

Topic, organization, and country portals form research centers around issues covering energy systems, health care, agriculture, climate change, population, and economic development. Portals include authoritative analysis, academic journals, news, case studies, legislation, conference proceedings, primary source documents, statistics, and rich multimedia. Use Browse Issues and Topics, World Map, Basic Search or Advanced Search to explore the database.

Grzimek's Animal Life



Animal Life on the web provides students and researchers with a dynamic, interactive resource that fosters more discussion and critical thinking skills.

Bernhard Grzimek, the famous zoologist and Director of the Frankfurt Zoo, published the Grzimek's Animal Life Encyclopedia in 1968.

Gale updated the print set in 2004, including new articles and commissioning additional images. Grzimek's This new web product uses the content from the encyclopedia to provide unequalled coverage on more than 4,000 species, and includes more than 11,000 images, videos, illustrations, and maps.
